



## 2020 Los Angeles Rams Postgame Notes Rams 24, Bears 10 Week 7 • October 26, 2020





### **Rams Team Notes**

- The win against Chicago, marks the first time since 1988 the Rams have defeated the Bears on Monday night.
- The Rams held the Bears to 10 total points, the fewest point total for the Chicago this season.
- The defensive unit held the Bears to only 49 yards rushing, marking the second game under Defensive Coordinator **Brandon Staley** L.A. held its opponent to under 50-yards rushing.
- Seven Rams defensive players amassed five or more tackles on the night, led by LB Micah Kiser with eight.
- P Johnny Hekker sailed a 63-yard punt late in the fourth quarter to pin the Bears deep in their own territory. All five of Hekker's punts were down inside Chicago's 10-yard line.
- Rookie TE Brycen Hopkins made his first professional appearance.

#### **Rams Offensive Notes**



- Goff's 4-yard TD pass to WR Josh Reynolds marked Goff's 98th career TD, matching QB Bob Waterfield for the sixth-most passing TDs in franchise history.
- On the 12-yard TD pass from Goff to TE Gerald Everett, Goff has now surpassed 16,000 passing yards in his career.
- RB Malcolm Brown ended the night with 10 rushing attempts for 57 yards and one touchdown.
- TE Johnny Mundt ended the night with three receptions for 47 yards, both are single-game highs in his career. Additionally, Mundt's 34-yard reception was the longest of his career.
- WR Cooper Kupp became the 16th player in franchise history to eclipse 3000 receiving yard with the club. Kupp caught all six targets for 43 receiving yards.
- WR Josh Reynolds hauled in four receptions for 52 yards and one touchdown.

- CB Jalen Ramsey grabbed his first interception of the season to help seal the Rams win in the waning minutes of the game.
- S Taylor Rapp nabbed his first pick of the season and third interception of his career on a Bears QB Nick Foles throw to the endzone with 5:07 remaining in the third quarter. Rapp also totaled seven tackles (two solo).
- OLB Leonard Floyd levied 2.0 sacks against his former team to reach 22.5 total sacks in his career.
- LB Justin Hollins recorded his first sack as a Ram to force the second turnover on downs for the Rams defensive unit.
- With DL Aaron Donald and DL Greg Gaines tallying 0.5 sacks, the Rams totaled four total sacks on the season
- OLB Terrell Lewis posted his first career tackle on a key fourth down stop at the end of the third quarter.
